The 1979 recording by the renowned storyteller Duncan Williamson of Argyll (1928-2007) was subsequently illustrated in a series of paintings by artist **John Slavin**, then selected by **Christine Martin** for film development by animist **John McGeoch**. The Twa Ravens film is enhanced by the musical interpretation of **Jack Evans** and members of the **Harta** music ensemble.



Lighthouse Lives

6pm (1hr)

This film captures the lived experiences of the people who worked for the Northern Lighthouse Board, through a time of transition, from manned to automated lighthouses. Resonant archive voices and visual imagery allow us an authentic sense of life, against a dramatic natural back-drop. Film-makers Martine Robertson and Erin Farley from GaelGal Creations are introduced by the Northern Lighthouse Board.

SAT 22 OCT

Language is vital to cultural identity. North America's First Nations handed on their culture through oral tradition, as did the Gaelic speaking emigrants to the maritime territories of what was to become Canada. Storvtellers Julie Pellissier-Lush and John Shaw share stories and traditions from the Mi'kmag and Gaelic speaking cultures that they are preserving and passing on.

Land of the MacGregor

From the hills and glens of the Trossachs to Loch Lomond and Argyll, you are in the land of Clan Gregor. Storyteller and former shepherd John Barrington is our unsurpassed guide to a landscape that has seen bloody conflict, persecution and unexpected survivals for the people denied their own name.

Saut an Bluid: A Scots Saga

4pm (1hr)

The full smeddum of Scotland's Norse saga unfolds, as **Donald Smith** introduces his new epic Scots telling, through Norse eyes and tongues. Who is Skald the Ferryman? What is his connection with the Maid of Norway, and the Corryvreckan whirlpool?

The Story of Auslag: A Saga from Unst

6pm (1hr)

Discover a Shetland story dating back to the 800s, steeped in both historic truth and elements of myth. A Jarl's daughter, Auslag was an outcast who soon became one of the most powerful figures in Unst, her home island. Based on Andrew T. Cluness' *Trouble With Trolls*, Shetland storyteller Marjolein Robertson brings Auslag's story to life with the rugged richness of Shetlandic language and landscape.

TUE 25 OCT

Storytelling and Worldview: The Legacy of Duncan Williamson and Betsy Whyte

Alan Bruford Lecture 6pm (1hr) | Free (ticketed)

The Alan Bruford Lecture this year is presented by **Prof. John T Niles**, one of the world's greatest scholars of oral storytelling. It marks the publication of his book *Webspinner: Songs, Stories, and Reflections of Duncan Williamson, Scottish Traveller.*

The lecture is given in memory of Scottish scholar Alan Bruford and is presented by the University of Edinburgh's Department of Celtic and Scottish Studies.

WED 26 OCT

We All Have a Story to Tell

4pm (1hr) | Free (ticketed)

Deafblind Scotland launches an important new video, featuring deafblind people sharing their experiences. Participants have been guided by storyteller Anne Dignan and poet Andrew Pettigrew, both of whom are deafblind. Through their stories, they explore their right to be recognised as a unique community, included in all aspects of society – one of the rights laid out in the Scottish Deafblind community's new Manifesto of Rights.

The purpose of the video is to empower the deafblind community, while challenging stereotypes and reducing social distance – the biggest barriers to inclusion.

Wir Leid: Scots for a New Generation

6pm (1hr)

Young artists Ailsa Dixon and Neil Sutcliffe shine a light on Scots words, expressions and sayings, exploring how they relate to modern culture. They share folktales in Scots and Doric, integrated with a conversation about how they interact with the language in their own lives and with their peers. The show will feature a mix of traditional storytelling and music, with strong audience input.

FRI 28 OCT

Recovering Our Culture

6pm (1hr)

The Mi'kmaq Language Act commits the Province of Nova Scotia to work closely with Mi'kmaq communities and organisations such as Mi'kmaq Kina'matnewey to develop a language revitalization strategy. Julie Pellissier-Lush shares her work as a storyteller and traditional historian, and how it can contribute to the recovery of the First Peoples of Nova Scotia.

SAT 29 OCT

Home Where I Belong

6pm (1hr)

Two migratory birds trace the patterns of the journeys that brought them to build their nests in the heartland of Scotland. The history of Scotland is based on the movement of people, yet the stories we hear tend to be dark and difficult. Together, storytellers **Linda Perttula** and **Claire Hewitt** weave Finnish and English words to create the world from a bird's egg.

SUN 30 OCT

Female Powers: Fairy Queens and Witches

6pm (1hr)

Folk music duo Pictism and storyteller Stuart McHardy present a magical interlude of ancient ballads and stories, with a focus on Halloween and its feminine themes. Weaving together tales of female deer cults, goddesses of the landscape, and the symbolic actions of witches, this performance promises an enriching reflection on the feminine in Scottish folklore.



MON 31 OCT

The Witchcraft Persecution: A Commemoration

4pm (1hr 30)

"Many were accused as witches because they were outspoken or skilled women. Feared because it was believed that they could charm, curse, and cast spells with their voices. Our tongues have been silenced for too long. It is time to tell their stories".

This performance is a creative collaboration between storyteller Rowan Morrison and artist Karen Strang, using visual art to enable the unspoken to be seen and heard.

Sgiath: Warrior Queen of Skye

6pm (1hr 15)




